General Occupational Hazards

<u>Asbestos</u> Mineral fiber used in older buildings and ships; if inhaled deeply into the lungs can cause health problems



Industrial Solvents Usually liquid, used to dissolve, degrease, clean, strip paint, etc.



PCBs Polychlorinated biphenyl used as coolant and insulating fluid



<u>Vibration</u> Periodic back and forth movement that if severe, can cause health conditions



<u>Lead</u> Metal that can be toxic for certain uses



<u>Noise</u>

Harmful sounds from guns, equipment, and machinery that is often experienced during service



<u>Radiation</u> Dental technicians, nuclear weapons technicians, and others with routine and usually safe exposure



CARC Paint

Chemical Agent Resistant Coating (CARC) used on military vehicles to resist corrosion and chemical agents



<u>Fuels</u> (Petroleum, Oils, Lubricants) Fuels such as diesel and JP-8 used to operate vehicles in the military
